1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Preston Motorcycle Club (PMCC) hereafter called the Promoter will conduct The Pirelli Motul Victorian Road Racing Championships for Victorian Championship and Support Classes at The Bend Motorsports Park, on 15-17 March (as per South Australian Road racing Championship series supp regs), Broadford State Motorcycle Sports Complex on 4^{th} and 5^{th} May and 16^{th} and 17^{th} November 2024 and The Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit on 13-17 September.

2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The abovementioned Event has been authorised by Motorcycling Victoria which has issued the Motorcycling Australia PermitNumbers to be confirmed as prior to each event and included in round supp regs on the Ridernet online entry. The series is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Senior National and Junior National Race Licences.
- 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs), these Supplementary Regulations, MA policies, and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling Victoria. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with such rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

4. ENTRIES

- **4.1** Entries will open approximately six weeks prior to each round and will remain open until close of business (local time) 2 weeks prior to the event. Late entries will be accepted until 1 week prior to the event at the discretion of the promoter.
- **4.2** Only entries received via RiderNet will be accepted. Alternate arrangements must be approved by the event contact.
- **4.3** In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Promoter, subject to the prior express approval of Motorcycling Victoria
- **4.4** Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs The Preston Motorcycle Club, in writing, 7 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 7 days before the event. Consideration will be given for valid reasons, and at the discretion of the promoter.

- 5.2 Payment by credit / debit card only. Payment to be made for entry to be confirmed.
- 5.3 Cheques and Money Orders will not be accepted.

6. ENTRY PASSES

Spectator entry to all rounds is free. If you require passes this will be communicated in the final instructions for each round.

7. INSURANCE

- 7.1 Those who hold an MA licence current for the duration of the Event, and officials, who are signed on for the Event are covered by MA's National Personal Accident Scheme which provides basic cover for rehabilitation expenses and death and permanent disability benefits. For more information see Insurance Motorcycling Australia (ma.org.au)
- **7.2** Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors consider taking out weekly benefits insurance.

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Event Medical Team will provide medical services for rounds two, three and four and will be at the venue from 08:30 to 5:30pm each day.

The Cafnix Club will be providing medical services for round 1 as per the 2024 South Australian Road racing State Championships, permitted by Motorcycling South Australia.

9. SCRUTINEERING

- **9.1** Scrutineering will begin at 07:15 am on the Saturday of each round. Arrangements for early scrutineering for each round will be confirmed in the final instructions for that round.
- **9.2** Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.
- **9.3** Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place atany time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.
- 9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be always available to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

10. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

10.1 Any rider who competes in 3 or more rounds of the Victorian Road Racing Championships is eligible for points for that Championship. An updated version of points will be available after each round and revised and released at the completion of Round three. Points from riders who did not compete in three rounds upon completion of round four will be removed from the Victorian series.

10.3 SUPERBIKE

- I. 1000cc four-cylinder 4-stroke and 1300cc two-cylinder 4-stroke (Including Aprilia RSV 1100)
- II. Refer to GCR <u>SECTION 6E 6.18 SUPERBIKE</u>

10.4 SUPERSPORT

- I. 15 years and over. Endorsement applies.
- II. 400cc up to 600cc four-cylinder 4-stroke / 500cc up to 675cc three-cylinder 4-stroke / 600cc up to 750cc two-cylinder 4-stroke.
- III. Capacity and configuration GCR 6.19 SUPERSPORT

10.5 SUPERSPORT 300 - Production

- I. 14 years and over. Endorsement applies
- II. 250cc/ 300cc/ 500cc single or twin-cylinder 4-stroke
- III. Capacity and configuration as per SRs
- IV. Capacity and configuration GCR 6.20 PRODUCTION

10.6 SUPERMOTO OPEN

- I. Up to 550cc 2-stroke and 700cc 4-stroke
- II. Open class. No grading used.
- III. Knobby tyres are not permitted.
- IV. The racing track will be part bitumen and part dirt. If conditions become unsuitable, the track will be short road circuit.
- V. Capacity and configuration GCR SECTION 14 for requirements

10.7 Juniors (Up to160cc production)

I. Competitors must be ages 11 to under 16yrs.

9 to under 15 - 85GP

11 to under 16 - 150 Production.

- II. **Please Note:** If there is an age gap of more than 4 years for junior riders in the event, a decision will be made by Motorcycling Australia/Victoria Officials whether to allow the younger riders to participate.
- III. See GCR SECTION 6 for Junior eligibility and requirements

10.8SIDECARS

I. Please refer to the 2024 Australian Road-Racing Sidecar Series supplementary Regulations for this class. 2024 Australian Road Racing Sidecar Series Supp Regs

10.9SUPPORT CLASSES

The support class championship will be held over the four Victorian rounds.

10.10 FORMULA SPORT

Includes the following classes Thunderbike (2 cylinder 4 stroke over 700cc and triple-cylinder bikes) Pre-Modern 1000cc & 600cc and Period 6 & 7 Unlimited. BEARS F1 & F2 and Roaring Sporties may be combined if appropriate as determined by the Clerk of Course.

- I. **Thunderbike** must be 2-cylinder 4 stroke over 700cc and triple cylinder bikes.
- II. Period 6 must be a model manufactured and sold between 1983 & 1990 inclusively. Logbook required.
- III. Period 7 must be a model manufactured and sold between 1991 & 2000 inclusively.
- IV. **Pre-Modern** must be a model manufactured and sold prior to 31st December 2013.
- V. Formula 2 must be 500cc up to 675cc three-cylinder 4-stroke 600cc up to 750cc two-cylinder 4-stroke.

- VI. All competitors must be 16 years of age or over.
- VII. All other rules as per 2024 GCR.

10.11 LIMITED SPORT

Includes the following classes.

- i. **Formula 400** must be 4-cylinder Four stroke 400cc or under.
- ii. **Twin Sprint** must be 2 cylinder 4 strokes under 700cc.
- iii. **Supermono** (no GP engines)
- iv. **250cc Road bike** must be of a production bike, of which the make and model lawfully sold in Australia or as a Japanese import, be as constructed by the manufacturer to conform to Australian Design Rules for normal road use And can be a two or four-stroke, up to 4-cylinder engine, with a capacity of no more than 260cc.
- v. Moto 3/125GP machines included.

11. OZBEARS CLASSES

Please note: There will be no Victorian BEARS rounds for 2024. All Victorian rounds will be counted towards the National OZBEARS Challenge. OZBEARS classes according to National Challenge rules for 2024.

- i. **OZBEARS FORMULA 1** Lower Power to weight ratio = 0.96, Upper power-to-weight ratio = Unlimited
- ii. **OZBEARS FORMULA 2** Lower Power to weight ratio = 0.725, Upper power-to-weight ratio = 0.959.
- iii. **OZBEARS FORMULA 3** Lower Power to weight ratio = 0.52, Upper power-to-weight ratio = 0.724
- iv. OZBEARS FORMULA 4 HERITAGE (Incorporating Roaring Sporties). No Tyre/Wheel Restrictions
 Motor Design Pre-1985, including head and crankcases; Motor Manufacture can be after 1985; Frame tubular steel; Front Forks Free; Wheels Free; e.g. BULTACO; BMW Boxer R60 R100 (4 valve heads may be fitted), R
 NINE-T, BMW 1100-1150 Boxer; BUELL 2 valve up to 1200cc, pre-2003 Cyclone, Thunderbolt, Battletwin; DUCATI all
 Bevel drives, Pantah, TT2, 750F1, Sport Classic range (2-valve); HARLEY DAVIDSON 750 Street Rod, 883-1200,
 Roaring Sporties, V-Rod; LAVERDA SFC 750, Jota, RGS; MOTO GUZZI (all models excluding MGS01); NORTON 961;
 Royal Enfield Interceptor and Continental 650; SINGLE CYLINDER BSA, Norton, Velocette etc; TRIUMPH Bonneville,
 Trident, Thruxton (900cc and 1200cc range); VEE TWO Alchemy,
- v. **BEARS FORMULA 5** Lower Power to weight ratio = 0.1, Upper power-to-weight ratio = 0.519.

12. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

- 10.3 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of contestants entered and competingin each class shall be 15 except for Juniors, where the number of contestants shall be 6.
- 10.4 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining a placing for a support class championship, the number of contestants competing in each class shall be 6.
- 10.5 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combineevents and re-distribute any awards and/or prizemoney, will be at the discretion of the Promoter, subject to the prior express approval of the RCB.

11 STARTS AND FINISHES

Race starts will be conducted by lights. See Manual of Motorsport GCR 6.12.6 - 9 Starts and 6.12.10 Finishes.

12 FLAGS AND SIGNALS

Refer to GCR SECTION 6.2.1 for flags and signals information

13 RACE FORMAT

Championship classes will each complete 2 x 10-minute qualifying and 3 x races over the course of the event. The number of laps will vary, based on the track size.

Support classes, OZBEARS and Roaring Sporties Australia will each complete 1 x 15 minute qualifying session and 4 x races over the course of the weekend.

Points will be calculated via Manual of Motorsport <u>GCR 6.12.16.1.</u> See section 10.1 of this document with regards to series championship eligibility.

14 EVENT SCHEDULE

See appendix 1 for provisional schedules for each round. Any changes to the schedule must be requested no less than two weeks prior to the event being held.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 07:30 am with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

15 AWARDS AND PRIZEONEY

- 15.1 Trophies will be awarded for the first 3 place getters in each class at every round (including B and C grade for Superbike and Supersport 600 Victorian graded riders). Trophies and prize money will be presented to the first 3 place getters in the Harvey Wiltshire and Hughie Hoare feature races at the conclusion of the Phillip Island weekend.
- 15.2 At the conclusion of the series, trophies will be awarded to the first 3 place getters in the series for the Victorian Championships and support races.
- 15.3 If less than eligible competitor numbers in a class, trophies will only be awarded at PMCC's and MV's discretion.
- 15.4 Round 4 trophies will be awarded to only Superbike (Outright, B and C grade), Supersport 600 (Outright, B and C grade), Supersport 300 & BEARS classes. Trophies may be awarded to support classes at the discretion of the promoter.

16 PAYG

PAYG Withholding affects the payment of prizemoney. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter must withhold 46.5% of prizemoney over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you. Please tick one of the boxes on the entry form and if appropriate provide your ABN to ensure the full amount of prize money is paid to you.

17 PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will be held approximately 40 minutes after the final race of the day and may be withheld subject to protest.

18 MACHINES AND RIDERS

- 18.1All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Road Race competition.
- 18.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 18.3 Machines must not be started until 9:00am or at the direction of the Clerk of Course.
- 18.4 Machine changes are permitted. Competitors must seek permission of the Race Secretary. Secondary machines

must be scrutineered prior to submission of the request.

19 RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Promoter's discretion.

All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than that specified by the promoter.

20 GRID POSITIONS

Grid positions for each event will be determined from merged qualifying times and will be based on fastest times recorded.

- 20.1 Where there is a failure with the timing system, gridding will be at the discretion of senior officials.
- 20.2 For Championship classes, grids will be static for all three races.
- 20.3 All Formula Sport, Limited Sport and BEARS races, will be progressive grids. Grid position for leg 1 will be determined by the qualifying session. Races 2, 3 and 4 grid positions will be determined by the finishing position in the previous leg.
- 20.4 Refer to <u>6.12.7 Starting Grid Format: Solo</u>

21 RIDER'S BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

22 CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

See appendix 2 for circuit descriptions and track maps

23 TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on-track participation. This inspectionmust be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

23.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course. If thoseconcerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

24 FACILITIES

All facilities have access to pit sheds and power. Space is limited. Shed spaces can be booked via the products section in the online entry.

Broadford: Camping available (\$10 pp per night), canteen, showers.

Phillip Island: No camping available, canteen, showers.

The Bend: No camping. Canteen / Hotel / showers.

25 NOISE

Sound emissions must comply with Section 6.14 onward in the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport and not exceed 95dB measured at 30m.

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course. Refer to GCR Appendix C for details.

26 TYRES

For competitors to be eligible for Pirelli tyre prizes (excluding random draw), they must be running Pirelli tyres for the event. Machines will be checked at the completion of each leg.

Race Bike Tyre Suppliers are the official Pirelli tyre Service for all rounds. Orders must be placed 2 weeks prior to each event by contacting Mark Lamont Ph: 0430 189 348.

27 ANTI-DOPING POLICY

- 27.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to MA website for details.
- 27.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, ph. 1800020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at Motorcycling Victoria's discretion until the results of the tests are known.

28 DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer toMA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

29 CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's zero tolerance of poor behavior, either on or off track. The codification of the behaviors expected of MA members and all who attend or participate in motorcycling is contained within MA's policies, including its Member Welfare Policy and its Social Media Policy, which can be found at Policies - Motorcycling Australia (ma.org.au).

30 FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders should have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

31 ADMISSION CHARGES

There are no entry fees for spectators to all rounds of the series. Spectators are welcome and are reminded to follow all instructions of officials at the event.



CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PIRELLI MOTUL VICTORIAN ROAD RACING CHAMPIONSHIPS

IMPORTANT - THIS IS A CONTRACT. YOU MUST READ AND SIGN THIS CONTRACT BEFORE YOU PARTICIPATE.

Waiver Agreement

Recitals

- A. The Provider organises, and permits participants to participate in, the Recreational Activity in consideration for the Participant:
 - a. If a rider, paying the Application Fee; and
 - b. If a volunteer official volunteering to officiate at the Recreational Activity;
 - c. If a member of the media, accepting the Provider's terms of media accreditation; and

otherwise agreeing to be bound by the Provider's rules and directives governing the conduct of the Recreational Activity.

- B. This document is the contract between the Provider and the Participant with respect to the Participant's participation in the Recreational Activity.
- C. The purposes of this contract include to:
 - exclude the liability of the Provider to the extent permissible by law to pay damages or any other form of compensation whether arising in tort contract or statute or at law or in equity for any personal injury or death of the Participant as a result of the participant's participation in the Recreational Activity; and
 - b. provide a warning of the risks of engaging in the Recreational Activity (as defined below).
- D. Participating in the Recreational Activity is dangerous. The risks include but are not limited to death, serious injury or illness due to:
 - falling from your bike;
 - difficult terrain and obstacles;
 - hazardous and changeable track conditions;
 - rider error and/or lack of skill or care and/or dangerous or reckless behaviour on your part or the part of other participants;
 - undisclosed medical conditions;
 - decisions made or not made by organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings;
 - heat, cold, wet or other adverse weather conditions;
 - contact with vehicles, other participants or members of the public who may or may not be acting safely;
 - lack of access to medical, evacuation or search services; or
 - design of the track.

Operative parts

- 1. In consideration for me (the Participant) paying or providing the consideration under clause A above to participate in the Recreational Activity, the Provider will permit me to participate in the Recreational Activity.
- 2. I acknowledge that the Recreational Activity involves the risk of serious injury, physical harm or death. I warrant that I am aware that the Recreational Activity involves the risk of serious injury, physical harm or death.
- 3. I also acknowledge that in signing this contract I have done so voluntarily and that no pressure or unfair tactics have been used to persuade me to sign this contract and that I have done so voluntarily in the knowledge that it is open to me not to sign the contract and for the Provider to refuse to permit me to participate in the Recreational Activity. I also warrant that I have been given sufficient opportunity to read this contract before signing it and that I have read it.
- 4. I agree that the Provider and any directors or officers of the Provider and any person associated with organising the Recreational Activity shall not be liable to me or any other person for damages, compensation or loss, whether in tort, contract, under statute or at law or in equity or otherwise for any personal injury or death caused by, or in connection with, or arising out of, my participation in the Recreational Activity.

Definitions

Application Fee means the fee payable by the Participant (as a rider) to participate in the Recreational Activity.

Participant means the person signing this form and whose name appears next to Participant below.

Provider means those persons and entities listed in Annexure 1.

Recreational Activity means the event specified in Annexure 2.

Participant acknowledgements, consents and authorisations

- i. I acknowledge that it is my responsibility to only participate in the Recreational Activity if I am fit and able to do so.
- ii. I acknowledge that I am responsible for all medical, hospital and ambulance expenses arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activity save for any benefits provided by MA's Personal Accident Policy.
- iii. I authorise and consent to the Provider arranging any medical, hospital or ambulance services on my behalf if necessary arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activity.
- iv. I authorise and consent to the Provider collecting and using my personal information for the purpose of administering the Recreational Activity and in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- v. I authorise and consent to the Provider collecting my private health information from me and from any person or entity providing me with medical, hospital or ambulance services arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activities, and to the use of such information to reduce the risks to persons participating in recreational activities, in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- vi. I acknowledge that I have agreed to, and am bound by, the Provider's rules and directives governing the conduct of the Recreational Activity, including the MA anti-doping policy and understand that I may be subject to drug testing.



vii. I authorise and consent to photographs and electronic images (images) being taken of me in the course of the Recreational Activity. I have no proprietary interest in the images. I authorise and consent to the Provider using such images, my name and information about my participation in the Recreational Activity to promote the Provider or any recreational activities organised by the Provider.

Additional Clauses for Victorian Events

SCHEDULE 2

WARNING: If you participate in these activities your rights to sue the supplier under the *Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012* if you are killed or injured because the activities were not supplied with due care and skill or were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in or on this notice.

If you sign this form, you will be agreeing to exclude, restrict or modify the supplier's liability with the result that compensation may not be payable if you or the third party consumer suffer personal injury.

Important

You do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form.

The supplier may refuse to provide you with the services if you do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. Even if you sign this form, you may still have further legal rights against the supplier.

A child under the age of 18 cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her rights.

A parent or guardian of a child who acquires recreational services for the child cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify the child's rights.

Agreement to exclude, restrict or modify your rights:

I agree that the liability of the Provider for any personal injury that may result from the supply of the recreational services that may be suffered by me (or a person for whom or on whose behalf I am acquiring the services) is excluded.

Definitions

- 1. **Recreational services** are services that consist of participation in:
- a sporting activity or similar leisure-time pursuit; or
- any other activity that involves a significant degree of physical exertion or risk and is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
- 2. *Personal injury* is bodily injury and includes mental and nervous shock and death.
